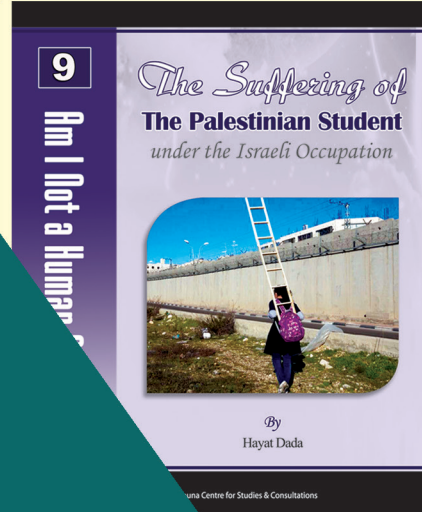

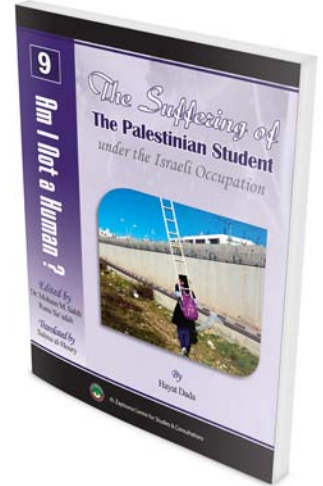

1. *The Suffering of the Palestinian Student under the Israeli Occupation (English)*

The book endeavors to present a full and complete picture of the suffering of Palestinian student under Israeli occupation. The Israeli authorities have endeavored to tighten their grip on the Palestinian education sector, through controlling the educational process, in its comprehensive concept and all its elements. These include the curriculum, the school, the teacher and the student, with the aim to obtain outcomes that are in line with Israel's future plans for the occupied territories. The book reviews the most important international legislation relative to the right to education in times of peace and war, the impact of Israeli policies that seek to impose ignorance on Palestinians, and the effect of daily attacks, the siege and the Separation Wall on the Palestinian student. This book is the 9th in the series "Am I Not A Human?" which is issued by al-Zaytouna Centre.

2. *Al-Jama'ah Al-Islamiyyah in Lebanon: 1975–2000 (Arabic)*

This book tackles the organizational evolution of the group, the spread of its doctrine, the political and military performance, and the institutionalized work of al-Jama'ah. 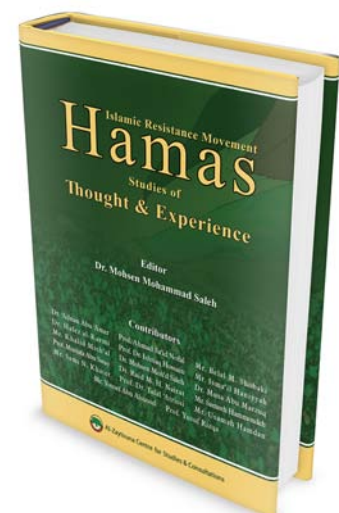

4. *Islamic Resistance Movement (Hamas): Studies of Thought & Experience (English)*

The book examines Hamas’s vision and experience in all its aspects. It falls in two parts. The first is a collection of eleven studies on Hamas and its experience; including the inception; political vision; conceptualization of the other; the relationship with the Palestine Liberation Organization (PLO) and its factions, and the Islamic Palestinian movements; the peace process; Hamas’s vision for political and social reform in Palestine; Arab and Islamic relations; and its experience in government. While the eleventh chapter reviews Western academic literature on Hamas.

The second part of the book includes contributions by five senior Hamas leaders attempting to answer a miscellany of questions regarding different issues appertaining to the Movement.

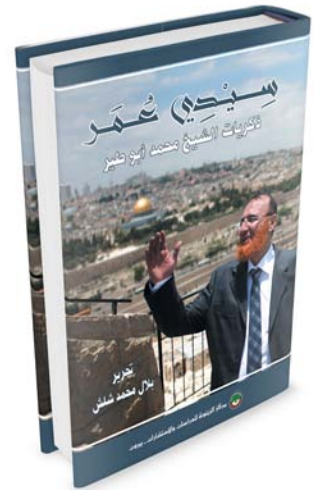

5. *Sidi ‘Umar: The Memoirs of Muhammad Abu Tair About Resistance and His 33 Years in the Israeli Jails (Arabic)*

One of the most prominent books on the experience of Palestinian prisoners in Israeli jails published in modern Palestinian history. It chronicles more than forty years of the Palestinian prisoner’s experience, from the viewpoint of Sheikh Muhammad Abu Tair, from his membership of Fatah, then al-Jama‘ah al-Islamiyyah, and then Hamas.

Sheikh Muhammad Abu Tair is one of the most prominent leaders in Palestine and one of the most prominent symbols of prisoners in Israeli jails. He is a former Fatah militant symbol, then a symbol of leadership in Hamas and a member of the Palestinian Legislative Council (PLC).

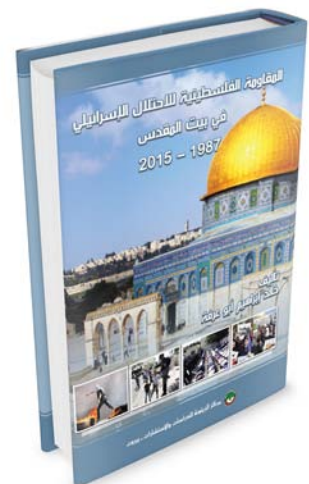

6. *The Palestinian Resistance Against Israeli Occupation of Jerusalem 1987–2015 (Arabic)*

This book highlights the historical sequence of uprisings and protests, and the motives behind Palestinians’ insistence to resist the Israeli occupation, which was the first reason to obstruct the absolute Judaization of the city. It tackles how the resistance in Jerusalem has developed its performance in accordance to the Israeli security developments. Moreover, the book explains how resistance passes through generations without stoppage.

It is a qualitative addition to the sources sought by researchers into resistance in Jerusalem.

7. *Turkish-Israeli Relations 2002–2016 (Arabic)*

The book examines the various aspects of Turkish-Israeli relations, and explores the phases and developments they underwent in 2002–2016, in addition to how the two sides dealt with the cycles of deterioration and improvement in these relations.

Comprised of four chapters, the book offers a historic overview of the political, military, and economic ties between the two countries from 1949 to 2002. It discusses Turkey and Israel's shared interests in light of Turkey's new foreign policy following the victory of the Justice and Development Party (AKP) in the 2002 general election. Then it tackles the issues of contention between the two countries, and the impact on their relations at various levels. The author outlines the developments witnessed by Turkish-Israeli relations in 2015–2016, with Turkey's foreign policy seeking to build bridges with the Arab and Muslim world, and to lift the blockade on Gaza. Thus, concluding that Turkish-Israeli relations are currently improving, following a six-year period of diplomatic estrangement.

Prospects for Resettling Palestinian Refugees

Abstract

There have been leaked Israeli reports on a secret summit bringing Israel, and Jordan in the city of Aqaba, attended by United States State John Kerry in February 2016, accompanied by other leaks about an alleged offer presented by Egyptian President Abdul-Fattah el-Sisi for resettlement of Palestinians in an 1,000 square kilometer area to be located between Rafah and Anish. Although Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu denied the existence of such an Egyptian proposal, he admitted the summit took place. The Egyptian side, which avoided answering questions about the existence of the proposal.

However, there is something to be concerned about in the present context of resettling Palestinians in Sinai, and the possibility of putting pressure on the Egyptian regime, which is already facing several political, economic, and social challenges to accept them.

The scenarios include:

- 1) The possibility of a devastating Israeli war on Gaza Strip (Gaza) leading to the displacement of large numbers of its residents into Sinai.
- 2) The possibility that Egypt and Arab parties would accept the offer of resettlement of Palestinians in Sinai, with inducements and incentives; and
- 3) The possibility that the Palestinian people, supported by Arab and international entities, would be able to thwart the plans for re-settlement, with a different course of events.

The Future of Syria's Palestinians

Abstract

The legal status of the Palestinians in Syria has allowed them a national practice, which has shaped their political identity. Consequently, their leading role in the various stages of the Palestinian struggle has developed.

Syria's Palestinians have been divided in a manner similar to the Syrian society whose members have had different political alignment during the ongoing war. Human rights reports have documented cases of murder, detention, and displacement, which fall within the same scope of the Syrian situation in general.

Now after six years, the future is still a mystery which weighs heavily on the situation of Syria's Palestinians, especially with more than three-quarters of them concentrated in the capital, Damascus, which has witnessed substantial demographic shifts, and whose population has doubled from 4.4 million in 2010 to 8 million in 2016. This puts us in front of three possible scenarios, which are:

The First Scenario: Redistribution of Palestinians in Syria on the basis of 'fewer Palestinians in the capital and more in the outskirts.' The second scenario is the restoration of the Palestinians' status to its pre-2011 condition. The third scenario is the expulsion of Palestinians from Syria. Apparently, according to the available data, the first scenario is the most likely.

Third: Political Analyses and Articles

The Centre strives to raise the local, regional and international awareness about the realities and repercussions of the events in the region, with special reference to the Palestinian issue and the conflict with Israel. Therefore, it is in active cooperation with scholars, experts and specialists, publishing various analyses, articles and scholarly studies. Fourth: The Translation

The Translation Department at al-Zaytouna Centre provides the Centre's English website with all materials. Until September 2017, the Centre issued translations of 3 studies, 9 articles and 9 strategic assessments.

In 2017, the department published the 81th translation of *Tarjamat al-Zaytouna* series (Al-Zaytouna Translations). It is a study entitled "Turkey's Forward-Basing Posture," issued by Center for Economics and Foreign Policy Studies (EDAM). It "provides a contextual framework for understanding of Ankara's military basing strategy beyond its borders, consisting of deployments in Northern Cyprus, Qatar and Somalia, as well as deployments in Iraq and Syria. It concludes that Turkey does not have a single, standard forward basing model, and each contingent, major base, training facility, and forward operating base has its own political–military agenda."



Fifth: Information and Archives

The Information and Archives Department has an essential role in the work of al-Zaytouna Centre. The department daily follows the most important Arab, foreign and Israeli newspapers, news sites, Israeli and foreign research and study centers.

Apart from its regular work, the department provides information assistance to many researchers and academics, besides preparing several news reports on important current issue. It also prepares the Information Report series and the Information File series.

The department also issues "Palestine Today," an Arabic daily electronic newsletter dealing with all issues related to the Palestinian issue and the Arab-Israeli conflict. "Palestine Today," is issued without interruption throughout the days of the year where the department daily follows dozens of news sources in order to achieve this work.

The electronic newsletter provides rich material for researchers and specialists sparing them time and effort. It is characterized by an academic categorization, by which news can be easily browsed. After the news had been re-edited while maintaining their basic content, they are classified in an easy and comprehensive tab.

This electronic newsletter is freely available on the center's website. By 30 September 2017, the Centre had published 4,419 issues, out of which 259 were published the same year.



Sixth: Website and Social Media

Al-Zaytouna Centre website in both Arabic and English version has been updated during 2017.

Al-Zaytouna Centre is privileged with a very active and popular website in both Arabic and English languages. During 2017, we uploaded 105 materials of our own publications, papers, political analyses, strategic assessments, etc. With our policy of Free Download for the most of our academic products, we enjoyed about three hundred thousands of Downloads by our visitors (aside from millions of hits and visits). Our material is widely used by researchers, university lecturers and students, and media. Many postgraduate students (in Palestine, Jordan and other MENA countries) doing their MA theses and PhD dissertations covering topics on the Palestinian Issue in the last ten years, usually use our material. Besides, by the end of 2017, we had more than 67 thousand followers on Facebook.

Seventh: Conferences and Panel Discussions

To spread awareness on regional events at local, regional and international levels, the Centre holds panel discussions in accordance with its policy of openness to all ideas and intellectual and political trends. These specialized, scientific, objective, and free discussions address key issues and topics concerning the Palestinian issue. Hence, attaining results that best serve the Centre's stated objectives.

The discussions bring together a selection of specialists, researchers and experts on the Palestinian issue from around the world. They are highly organized and covered by the media.

These panel discussions are an important source for preparing books, reports and strategic assessments. The Centre publishes the minutes of the discussions on its site for the audience to benefit from them.

Up to the September 2017, the Centre had held 46 conferences and panel discussions, out of which three were held in 2017, and they are:

1. Conference: "The Issue of Palestine: Strategic Evaluation 2016 – Strategic Assessment 2017"

(Crowne Plaza Hotel in Beirut on 15/2/2017)

Al-Zaytouna Centre held this conference with the participation of a selection of experts, academicians and intellectuals interested in the Palestinian affairs, in which they discussed the main developments of the Palestinian issue during 2016, and tried to chart the likely trends that would shape the 2017 Palestinian scene.

The conference keynote address was delivered by Khalid Mish'al, head of Hamas's politburo, who focused on the Palestinian national experience and Hamas's role, as well as possible trends and prospects. Whereas, in the second and third sessions, six papers were presented where participants discussed the developments pertaining to the internal Palestinian scene, the Arab-Israeli scene, and the external forces and environment affecting the Palestinian issue.

Notably, this conference is the ninth in a series of strategic evaluation and assessment seminars held by al-Zaytouna Centre every year to discuss the developments and trends related to the Palestinian issue. <https://eng.alzaytouna.net/2017/02/23/conference-issue-palestine-strategic-evaluation-2016-strategic-assessment-2017-2/>



2. Panel Discussion: Palestinian Camps in Lebanon: Towards Comprehensive Solutions

(Al-Zaytouna Centre in Beirut on 19/4/2017)

This panel was held with the participation of a selection of researchers and specialists in the Palestinian and Lebanese affairs. It discussed the conditions of the Palestinian refugees in the refugee camps, and their sufferings due to the difficult economic, social, security and living conditions. Moreover, the panel explored the various solutions for such problems.

Eighth: Training

Al-Zaytouna Centre continued holding training courses and conducting consultations in 2016. Four training courses were held addressing the following titles:

1. Eagle Eye: The Formation of the World's Contemporary Political Map and Its Future Prospects

This training course was held thrice, first in Istanbul on 5–7/1/2017, the second in Kuwait on 27–29/4/2017 in cooperation with Horizon Center for Consultancy and Studies, and the third in Beirut at al-Zaytouna Centre on 17–19/8/2017. This course, which was facilitated by Dr. Mohsen Mohammad Saleh, tackled several titles. In this course, the intertwined broader picture of the modern world is explained, in addition to the historical background that led to the formation of the contemporary political map including the spheres of influence of the Great Powers. The balance of power and various factors affecting the course of events are explained, in addition to the prospects of change, the forces likely to rise or decline, and the potential tasks of the Arab and Muslim worlds.



2. Introduction into the Palestinian Issue

Al-Zaytouna Centre held this training course in English, on 15–19/5/2017. It was introduced by Dr. Mohsen Mohammad Saleh and Rana Sa'adah. The course introduced the participants with the most prominent aspects and backgrounds of the Palestinian issue. The course included the following topics: The Land of Palestine, People of Palestine, The Palestinian Armed Struggle in the Course of History, The State of Israel, and The Current Situation in Palestine and its Political Map.

The course included a field visit to Burj Barajneh and Shatila refugee camps, in order to closely see the difficult living conditions of Palestinian refugees in Lebanon, and visits to a number of humanitarian Palestinian organizations.



Ninth: Scientific Cooperation and Public Relations

The Centre was keen in 2017 to continue its academic relations with those who are interested and specialized in political and strategic studies. Besides those who are engaged in decision making in the region. This is in consistence with its policy of openness to actors and institutions involved in decision making, in addition to its openness cooperation and integration with the universities and centers working in the same domain. The Centre keeps in touch with them through conferences and seminars, visits and media.

The Centre's network of contacts includes politicians, academicians, researchers, think tanks and other figures working in the field of public policies related to the Middle East and the Palestinian issue. In this context, al-Zaytouna gave special attention to communicating with the Palestinian decision makers at home and abroad; the PLO, PA and different factions and political actors in the Palestinian arena. During 2017, more than 1,160 of those were contacted by al-Zaytouna, in addition to thousands of its subscribers

The Centre provided 27 consultations to MA and PhD researchers; in addition to evaluating 38 studies, which were sent to al-Zaytouna for publishing.

Tenth: Participation in Book Fairs

The Centre is adamant about the participation in local and international book fairs. The Centre seeks to publicize its achievements in general and to present its publications and market them in particular, in addition to maintaining direct communication with its audience in various countries.

Until September 2017, al-Zaytouna participated in two book fairs:

1. The 4th CNR Book Fair in Istanbul (24/2/2017–5/3/2017).
2. The 17th Amman International Book Fair (5–14/10/2017).



Eleventh: Al-Zaytouna in the Media

The Centre is keen to reach out to its audience. Its Public Relations and Media Department communicates with the various satellite channels, news agencies, local and international sites and websites, to introduce its activities and publications and to provide media coverage for the events it holds. In this context, the Centre supplies these institutions with the latest news on published books and summaries about the panel discussions, conferences and any other events it might organize.

In addition, al-Zaytouna provides media outlets with the latest information reports and strategic assessments it publishes.

It is also keen to accept media invitations to introduce the work of the Centre and its activities, or to comment on the major events within its domain, and participate in the fora and discussions on the different events.

During Jan.–Sep. 2017, the Media Department issued 50 press releases about the activities of the Centre. Many activities of the Centre were widely covered by the media. Our records show that about 130 media outlets covered one or more of our activities, including many important and popular satellite TV channels (e.g., Al Jazeera), newspapers, magazines, news agencies and websites. There is a list of 100 media outlets mentioned by name in our annual report (Al-Zaytouna Harvest 2016).

In addition, the Centre participated in many interviews with media institutions, including TV channels, radio stations, newspapers, news agencies and websites, among those are the following: Filastin al-Yawm TV, Al-Quds TV, Watan TV, Al-Yarmouk TV, Al-Aqsa TV, Radio Alam, Albachaer Radio, Fajr Radio, *Alresalah* newspaper, Shehab News Agency, and Felesteen Online.



Among the Centre's Major Achievements 2005–2017

1. The Centre has issued more than 160 books, mostly focusing on the Palestinian issue. High academic and qualitative standards are being strictly observed.
2. The Centre publishes the periodic *Palestinian Strategic Report* in both English and Arabic languages, since 2005. Nine volumes were published covering the period 2005–2015, in a comprehensive meticulous manner.
3. The Centre publishes the annual *Palestinian Documents*, since 2005. Seven volumes were published covering the period 2005–2011. Each volume contains about 900 pages.
4. The Centre has published 28 books of *Information Report* series, which is a collection of concise academic studies (booklets) focusing on the Palestinian issue.
5. The Centre has published 13 books of *Am I Not A Human?* series, which highlights the different aspects of the suffering of the Palestinian people, in both Arabic and English.
6. The Centre is the publisher of the Arabic daily electronic newsletter “Palestine Today.” More than 4,400 issues were published since May 2005.
7. The Centre has one of the most active websites in the region, in both English and Arabic languages.
8. The Centre has organised 46 periodic international conferences, panel discussions and brainstorming sessions on the Palestinian issue and the Arab-Israeli conflict till fall 2017. They have attracted wide interest of researchers, and received vast media coverage.
9. The Centre is active in Social Media, including Facebook (67,400 followers), Twitter, WhatsApp and Telegram, in addition to a YouTube Channel.
10. The Centre organises training courses in Political, Strategic and Futuristic fields.
11. The Centre issues the Daily Palestinian Chronicle on monthly basis.
12. The Centre has issued more than 100 Strategic Assessments, besides many Political analyses, etc.
