

Overview





The 288-page book presents a complete research on the mechanisms of forming elites within the two constituencies of the Palestinian political system. It analyzes the orientations of the Palestinian political elite towards the future of the Palestinian-Israeli conflict, and reveals the nature of their role in conflict management. It explores the stances of this elite towards the Palestinian national objectives, the mechanisms of conflict resolution, and mechanisms of an international and regional solution of the conflict.





This book deals with the Palestinian internal situation, security forces, the position on resistance forces, and the economic, demographic, educational and health conditions in the West Bank and Gaza Strip. It also addresses the problem of corruption in the Authority, its dealings with the media and its foreign relations.



6. *The Process of Israeli Decision Making: Mechanisms, Forces, and Influences* (English)

This book is an attempt to understand the Israeli decision-making process. The author explains how elements and forces within the labyrinth of the Israeli society exert influence on the decision-making mechanism and on how foreign policy and national security decisions are made. He expands on a number of external forces, or forces external to the decision-making process that are powerful enough to influence it. El-Gendy discusses the influence of five forces; the military, the advisors, two religious groups, the relationship with the United States, and the relationship with the Jewish Diaspora.

7. *Introduction to the Issue of Palestinian Refugees* (e-book) (English)






8. *The Analysis of the Pro-Israel Speech: India as a Case Study* (Arabic)

This book studies the Israeli discourse that established the Israeli-Indian relationship and penetrated the ruling policy-maker elite. It analyzes the Indian pro-Israel discourse, and discusses the legal aspect of relations with Israel, and notion that states must abide by international conventions.

9. *An Advisory Opinion on the Dissolution of the Palestinian Legislative Council (Arabic)*

This book includes two studies. In the first, Prof. Ahmed al-Khalidi discusses the legitimacy of the constitutional court decision to dissolve the Palestinian legislative Council (PLC), and the legal and political environment of the Palestinian Authority (PA) that helped to violate the Constitution. The second study by Dr. Anis F. Kassim discusses the legality of the presidential decision to dissolve the PLC, and presents the comments of some factions and prominent figures concerning the dissolution. He defines the competency of the Constitutional Court and discusses its interpretative ruling.

10. *The Outcome of the Israeli Knesset's: Legislative Process Laws and Bills 2015–2019 (Arabic)*

This study, which is a refereed academic article, endeavors to define the legislative mechanisms in the Knesset and their objectives, i.e., the enactment of legislations of different issues. It concentrates on the legislation process of the “occupier law” and its objective, by displaying the legislation process of the 20th Knesset, 2015–2019, the phases that the laws pass through. The study concludes that the results of the legislative process of the 20th Knesset, which include the laws and bills that did not reach the third and last reading, are in general not based on the principles of justice, the International humanitarian law, and the International humanitarian laws that regulate the laws of ordinary states.

11. *Israeli Unit 8200 and its Role in Serving Israeli Espionage Technology (Arabic)*

This study, which is a refereed academic article, attempts to shed light on the historical background of the Zionist intelligence activity, especially the founding of the Israeli Military Intelligence Unit 8200, which is specialized in cyber-surveillance technologies, and which some consider it the equivalent of the National Security Agency (NSA). This study has sought to highlight Israel's undeclared objectives in developing such technologies with the aim to realize security, political and economic gains at the international level.

12. *The Israeli Strategy Towards the Syrian Crisis 2011–2018 (Arabic)*

This study, which is a refereed academic article, tries to shed light on the Israeli strategy towards the Syrian crisis through monitoring the developments of the Syrian crisis and its repercussions on the Israeli national security; discussing the Israeli strategy in facing the challenges and threats in the Syrian arena; and unveiling the manner used by Israel in managing its relationships with the international and regional parties, active in the Syrian crisis.

Second: Strategic Assessment

This assessment is a periodic report characterized by its rich material. It seeks to study a particular incident or issue and anticipate its future developments. It highlights the likeliest scenario and then ends the assessment with some suggestions and recommendations.

The strategic assessment usually addresses the Palestine issue and the related Arab, Islamic and international dimensions. In addition, it tackles other issues, which fall within the Centre's interests.

Al-Zaytouna Centre had published 116 strategic assessments by the end of 2019, including 7 of which were published in that year and addressed the following topics:

1. The Prospects of the US Deal of the Century (February 2019).
2. The Return Marches: One Year After... Performance Evaluation and Future Scenarios (April 2019).
3. The Impact of the Israeli Elections on the Palestinian Situation (May 2019).
4. The Future of the Golan Heights Between Realism and Legalism (May 2019).
5. The Indian Elections and Their Impact on the Palestine Issue (June 2019).
6. The Measures of the Lebanese Ministry of Labor and the Palestinian Protest Movement (August 2019).
7. The Chinese-Israeli Relations and Its Prospects (November 2019), (in Arabic)



Third: The Translation

The Translation Department at al-Zaytouna Centre translates most of the Centre's publications, including books, studies, and articles, in addition to covering the Centre's activities, posting most of them on the Centre's English website. It keeps its English speaking audience, including experts and activists, informed of the latest developments concerning the Palestine issue.

The department issues the Arabic series "The Translation Series." It sheds lights on the most prominent articles and studies published by western or Israeli think tanks, which have an impact on the decision-making process in Israel and the west. Until the end of 2019, 83 translations were published, among which two were published in 2019:

1. Innovation, Blockchain and Artificial Intelligence in Israel (in Arabic)
2. The Evolving Israel-China Relationship (in Arabic)

During 2019, the Translation Department published the translations of 36 articles and 6 strategic assessments. It also published the English version of the advisory opinion of the Legal Expert Dr. Anis F. Kassim: *The Legality of the Presidential Decree to Dissolve the Palestinian Legislative Council*, in addition to covering al-Zaytouna's news and activities.



Fifth: The Website (alzaytouna.net)

In 2019, al-Zaytouna Centre website has undergone a number of updates, where the homepage tabular content was developed in addition to some internal pages. The website infrastructure has improved; increasing the browsing speed particularly in its mobile version. In 2019, the Centre added the push notification and the text-to-speech features to its website.

The site updates its visitors with the latest news of the Centre, its activities and publications. During 2019, we uploaded 101 of our publications on our website, in addition to 298 issues of “Palestine Today” electronic newsletter. Visitors can access a wide range of materials and services including the Strategic Assessment and al-Zaytouna translation series, in addition to a large collection of articles, studies, reports, documents, maps and selected books. Hence, our website is one of the richest in materials among Arab Think Tanks websites.

To encourage the spread of information, the site offers visitors free downloads of a number of the Centre’s publications. The download includes The Palestine Strategic Report, the Information Report series and other valuable books. Tens of thousands of downloads were done, making it the top website among similar Palestinian ones, in terms of the number of visitors and downloads.

In 2019, the center launched its Android app, while its social networking sites have been getting wide audience interaction, whether on its Facebook platform (which added the Facebook shop in 2019), or on Twitter, LinkedIn, YouTube and SoundCloud platforms.



Sixth: Conferences and Panel Discussions

To spread awareness on regional events at local, regional and international levels, the Centre holds panel discussions in accordance with its policy of openness to all ideas and intellectual and political trends. These specialized, scientific, objective, and free discussions address key issues and topics concerning the Palestine issue. Hence, attaining results that best serve the Centre's stated objectives.

The discussions bring together a selection of specialists, researchers and experts on the Palestine issue from around the world. They are highly organized and covered by the media.

These panel discussions are an important source for preparing books, reports and strategic assessments. The Centre publishes the minutes of the discussions on its site for the audience to benefit from them.

Up to the end of 2019, the Centre had held 54 conferences and panel discussions, out of which three were held in 2019, and they are:

1. Panel Discussion: The Impact of the Israeli Elections on the Palestinian Situation

(Al-Zaytouna Centre in Beirut on 2/5/2019)

Al-Zaytouna Centre for Studies and Consultations held this panel discussion with the participation of experts and specialists in Palestinian affairs. The discussion was kicked off by reviewing the most important results of the Israeli 21st Knesset. The participants expected Netanyahu to win a fifth term as prime minister, and saw that the general course of elections during the past twenty years indicates that the Israeli society has become more right-leaning and extreme. They opined that the northern front won't be affected by the latest Israeli elections, where the same consensus security policy would be implemented.



2. Seminar: The Deal of the Century and its Ramification on Lebanon

(Ramada Plaza, Beirut on 16/7/2019)

Al-Zaytouna Centre and Al Jazeera Centre for Studies in partnership with Al Jazeera Mubasher held this seminar, where a selected group of researchers and experts participated. The panelists discussed the historical and political contexts of the "deal of the century," focusing on its most important parts and latest developments. Analyzing the stances of the concerned parties, the possible changes, whether concerning Lebanon internally, or the Arab landscape, in general, and the Palestinian one, in particular. At the end, participants discussed the possible ramifications of the deal on the Lebanese arena and the Palestinian refugees there.



3. Panel Discussion: The Repercussions of the Lebanese Crisis on the Palestinian Refugees and the Ways to Overcome Them

(Al-Zaytouna Centre in Beirut on 3/12/2019)

The two-session discussion was full of rich content and constructive dialogue. Jaber Suleiman, the Palestinian refugee affairs expert, explained the repercussions of the crisis on the refugees, while Dr. Shafiq Shuaib, the professor at the Lebanese University, explained how the Lebanese behaved with the refugees. On these bases, experts and specialists continued their discussions and offered their recommendations.



Seventh: Consultations and Training

Al-Zaytouna Centre continued holding training courses and conducting consultations in 2019. Consultations were offered to 21 researchers and institutions, among which were many theses and dissertations. 52 studies were evaluated and peer reviewed, and were sent to al-Zaytouna for publishing.

Many training courses were held in 2019, among which is:

Training Course: Palestinian Resistance Against the British Occupation and the Zionist Project 1918–2018

This 6-hour training course was held on 17–18/7/2019 at the University of Yalova, Turkey and delivered Prof. Dr. Mohsen Mohammad Saleh. It was part of the First International Youth Scientific Forum, held by the Palestine Scholars Association in collaboration with the University of Yalova. It included a series of courses delivered, during the period 1/7/2019–21/7/2019, to 220 participants from 37 countries under the slogan “Together we accomplish.”



Eighth: Scientific Cooperation and Public Relations

The Centre was keen in 2019 to continue its academic relations with those who are interested and specialized in political and strategic studies, besides those who are engaged in decision making in the region. This is in consistence with its policy of openness to actors and institutions involved in decision making, in addition to its openness cooperation and integration with the universities and centers working in the same domain. The Centre keeps in touch with them through conferences and seminars, visits and media.

The Centre's network of contacts includes politicians, academicians, researchers, think tanks and other figures working in the field of public policies related to the Middle East and the Palestine issue. In this context, al-Zaytouna gave special attention to communicating with the Palestinian decision makers at home and abroad; the PLO, PA and different factions and political actors in the Palestinian arena. During 2019, more than 1,000 of those were contacted by al-Zaytouna, in addition to thousands of its subscribers.

Al-Zaytouna Centre was invited representing Palestine.
10. Conference: Beyond Turmoil: A Positive Agenda, held by Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation and ISPI, Rome, 6–7/11/2019. It was one of the Mediterranean Dialogues (MED) high-level conference, it included prominent participants, such as presidents, ministers, and political, academic and economic figures, from around 50 countries.



Ninth: Participation in Book Fairs

The Centre is adamant about the participation in local and international book fairs. The Centre seeks to publicize its achievements in general and to present its publications and market them in particular, in addition to maintaining direct communication with its audience in various countries.

During 2019, al-Zaytouna participated in two book fairs:

1. The 32nd Tehran International Book Fair (24/4–4/5/2019).
2. The 19th Amman International Book Fair (26/9–5/10/2019).



Tenth: Al-Zaytouna in the Media

The Centre is keen to reach out to its audience. Its Public Relations and Media Department communicates with the various satellite channels, news agencies, local and international sites and websites, to introduce its activities and publications and to provide media coverage for the events it holds. In this context, the Centre supplies these institutions with the latest news on published books and summaries about the panel discussions, conferences and any other events it might organize. In addition, al-Zaytouna provides media outlets with the latest information reports and strategic assessments it publishes.

It is also keen to accept media invitations to introduce the work of the Centre and its activities, or to comment on the major events within its domain, and participate in the fora and discussions on the different events.

During 2019, the Public Relations and Media Department issued 79 press articles about the activities of the Centre and its works, and documented these articles' publication in 170 different sources including newspapers, magazines, news agencies and websites. It also documented the publication of dozens of press articles about the Centre and its work in the media, other than the material published by the department itself.

In 2019, the department documented the participation of three of the Centre's researchers and representatives in tens of interviews with media institutions, including TV channels, radio stations, newspapers, news agencies and websites. Most of these events have focused on the issue of Palestine and the Arab-Israeli conflict.
